A Regular Study Session of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Rantoul was held at at 6:00 P.M. Mayor Hall called the proceeding to order.

Roll Call

The Clerk called the roll, finding the following members were physically present:

Approval of Agenda

Trustee Robertson moved to approve the agenda. Trustee Workman seconded the motion. On a roll call vote:

YEAS: Robertson, Haines, Workman and Wilson – 4.

NAYS: None – 0.

The motion carried 4-0.

Public Participation

Mayor Hall opened the public comment portion of the meeting per the Open Meetings Act.

- A. Tyshawn Rowan, a local business owner wanted to let the Board know his that his business picks up trash, leaves other things. He also wanted to know ways that the Village could assist small businesses.

Presentations

- A. Faith Freeman, a Manager with CliftonLarsonAllen, presented the Audit Report. She reported a clean, unaudited report which is the highest opinion the Village can receive. There were two financial findings: preparation of accrual of items for the Library and material adjustments. There have been continued improvements each year. Ms. Freeman thanked the Comptroller, Angie Schultz and her staff Lee McMahon and Josh Quinlan for their work on the Audit.

- B. Jolene Pacunas gave a presentation on the Daupler Notify system which is the new after-hours answering service for the Public Works Department. That number is 217-892-6526. Callers can leave a phone number to receive updates on the process of the repairs. This system also has the ability to send out mass notifications to neighborhoods for items such as power outages, water service problems or road closures.

Items from the Mayor

- A. The Mayor gave a list of local food resources and mentioned the csrantoul.org and c-uphd.org/food-pantries-in-champaign-county web sites.

Items from Trustees

- A. Trustee Wilson said the Food Pantry on Wabash Ave. would be willing to take any monetary donation.
- B. Trustee Robertson asked for an update on IUOE union negotiations. The Administrator said that all but one unfair labor charge has been dismissed. One is still pending.
- C. Trustee Wilson asked Chris Milliken if he could contact Midwest paving regarding the closure of Kentucky. There are no barriers to show the road is closed.
- D. Trustee Wilson spoke regarding employees receiving certifications and then becoming eligible for certification pay. A firefighter has asked to get their EMT certification and has been told that the Village will not pay for that. The Administrator said that decision was made by the Fire Chief.

Items from Community Planning and Development

- A. The Department is requesting the approval of an Ordinance authorizing the conveyance of real estate owned by the Village (1176 Bel Air Drive and 436 Steffler Street) to Habitat for Humanity of Champaign County. Habitat is interested in constructing single-family structures on the properties. They have two families selected and would build on these lots in 2026. The Village has had these lots for several years with no interest in them.
- B. The Department is requesting the approval of a Resolution authorizing and approving a Local Public Agency Agreement for State Participation Concerning the Construction and Maintenance of the Pleasant Acres Neighborhood Sidewalk Connections Project. This project includes extending existing sidewalks starting at Winston Park and along Gates Drive on the north. It then continues along Eater Drive to Harper Drive. The Village received notice of receipt of the ITEP grant from IDOT back on June 9, 2025. This particular grant was funded 100%.
- C. Chris Milliken gave an update on the downtown Reconstruction and Streetscaping project. They are working on storm sewers and sidewalks on Kentucky. The project is getting close to deadline and the Village has applied for an extension.

Items A & B will go to the Board.

Items from the Parks and Recreation

- A. The Department is requesting the approval of a one-year extension of a landscape Installation and Maintenance Contract with Deem Landscaping, Inc. in the amount of \$40,000.00 for the 2026 season. 22 pots were added downtown, This item will go to the Board.

Items from Public Works

- A. The Department is requesting the approval of a Construction Contract Change Order #4 with Grunloh Building Inc. in the amount of \$125,946.31 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant and Systems Project (Phase 1). This change order is requested because of necessary changes due to unforeseen reasons which will accomplished the overall goal of completing a successful project. This Change Order will be funded out of the contingency amount of the total loan. Terry Boyer, Lead Engineer was available for questions.
- B. The Department is requesting the approval of a Local Agency Agreement with the Illinois Department of Transportation, Department of Aeronautics in the amount of \$127,079.82 for Engineering and Construction costs to rehabilitate the Rantoul Aviation Center Runway 9-27. This is the north-south runway. This project was identified as the next improvement in the 2023 long-range improvement program. The design services have been completed, the project advertised and bids received on September 20, 2025. Cross Construction was the apparent low bidder in the amount of \$2,320,313.30.

- C. The Department is requesting approval for the purchase of two Disconnect Switches from MindCore Technologies (Electrorep) in the amount of \$23,200.00 for the Electric Department's new Prospect Substation Project. They are also requesting a contingency fund of \$1,160.00. This purchase was included in the FY 2026 Reserves Budget.
- D. The Department is requesting approval for the purchase of structural steel from Rohn Products, LLC in the amount of \$266,300.00 for the Electric Department New Prospect Substation Project. They are also requesting a contingency fund of \$13,315.00.

These items will go to the Board.

Items from Administrator

- A. The Administrator gave the annual Property Tax Levy Presentation.
- B. The Administrator is requesting the approval of a Resolution approving the need for a Public Hearing to determine the amounts of money necessary to be raised by the Tax Levy. That hearing will be held the first Tuesday in December at 5:45 pm. The Levy will be voted on at the Board Meeting.
- C. The Administrator discussed the proposal for the General Liability - Workers Compensation Insurance. There was significant \$400,000.00 damage at the Sports Complex this spring. The Village expected 20% increase but were quoted a 5.5% increase. The insurance recognized that straight line winds are a once-in-a-life time event and Workers Comp claims are down.

ORDINANCE 2807

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING TAXES FOR THE VILLAGE OF RANTOUL, CHAMPAIGN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, FOR THE 2025 TAX LEVY YEAR

-- ANNUAL TAX LEVY ORDINANCE --

WHEREAS, the Village of Rantoul, Champaign County, Illinois (the “**Village**”) is duly established and operates under and in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois, including the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 et seq.), as specifically supplemented and amended by the power and authority of the Village as a Home Rule Unit of Local Government under Section 6, Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 8-2-9.1 through Section 8-2-9.10 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-2-9.1 through 5/8-2-9.10), as supplemented and amended by the power and authority of the Village as a Home Rule Unit of Local Government, are effective in and for the Village, the same having been adopted by Ordinance No. 1547, passed on September 9, 1997, by a two-thirds vote of the President and Board of Trustees (the “**Corporate Authorities**”) of the Village and approved by the Village President on the same date as Article I, entitled “Annual Budget”, of Chapter 28, entitled “Finance” of the Village of Rantoul Code-1977, as subsequently supplemented and amended and now codified as Article II, entitled “Annual Budget”, of Chapter 14, entitled “FINANCE”, of the Code of Ordinances, Village of Rantoul, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2795, AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026, which was passed by the Corporate Authorities of the Village on April 8, 2025, and approved by the Village President on the same date, passed, approved, and adopted an annual budget for the fiscal year of the Village beginning May 1, 2025, and ending April 30, 2026, which such annual budget has, by subsequent Ordinances duly passed and approved by the Corporate Authorities, been supplemented and amended (as so supplemented and amended, the “**Annual Budget**”); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village desire to levy upon all property subject to taxation within the Village, as that property is assessed and equalized for state and county purposes for the 2025 tax levy year, the respective amounts set forth in this Ordinance, which such amounts are deemed necessary to defray the related expenses and liabilities for all such corporate purposes of the Village as have been appropriated for such purposes in the Annual Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF RANTOUL, CHAMPAIGN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. The provisions of the Annual Budget are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance to the same extent as if set forth in full herein. The total maximum amount of appropriations in the Annual Budget for all corporate purposes of the Village (except for appropriations for principal and interest due on outstanding bonded indebtedness, if any), which are legally made to be collected from the tax levy for the 2025 tax levy year, is hereby ascertained to be the sum of Two Million, Forty-Six Thousand, Ninety-Five Dollars (\$2,046,095.00).

Section 2. The sum of Two Million, Forty-Six Thousand, Ninety-Five Dollars (\$2,046,095.00), being the total of the appropriations heretofore legally made in the Annual Budget which is to be collected from the

tax levy for the 2025 tax levy year for all corporate purposes of the Village, including the purposes of providing for a General Fund, a Police Pension Fund, and the Rantoul Public Library Fund, (but excepting principal and interest due on outstanding bonded indebtedness, the levies for which are made in separate Ordinances, if any), as all such Funds have been appropriated in the Annual Budget for the current fiscal year of the Village, be and the same is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property in the Village subject to taxation for the 2025 tax levy year as such taxable property is equalized and assessed for state and county purposes. The specific amounts levied for the various purposes identified herein below are separately included herein by being placed in separate columns under the heading “Amounts to be Levied,” which appears over the same, the tax so levied being for the current fiscal year of the Village and for the appropriations in the Annual Budget to be collected from such tax levy, the total of which has been ascertained as aforesaid and being as follows:

Section 3. The total amount of One Million, Two Hundred Seventy-One Thousand, Six Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars (\$1,271,677.00), ascertained as provided in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance above, and as further summarized below, be, and the same is, hereby levied and assessed on all property subject to taxation within the Village according to the value of said property as the same is assessed and equalized for state and county purposes for the 2025 tax levy year:

Section 4. This Ordinance is adopted by the Corporate Authorities pursuant to the general procedures set forth in Section 8-3-1 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-3-1), including as specifically supplemented and amended by the power and authority of the Village as a Home Rule Unit of Local Government under Section 6, Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois; provided, however, that any tax rate limitation, or any other substantive limitation as to tax levies in the Illinois Municipal Code, or otherwise in conflict with this Ordinance shall not be applicable to this Ordinance pursuant to such Section 6, Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

Section 5. There is hereby certified to the County Clerk of Champaign County, Illinois, the several sums aforesaid, constituting the total amount (exclusive of the separate levies for principal and interest due on outstanding bonded indebtedness, if any) of One Million, Two Hundred Seventy-One Thousand, Six Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars (\$1,271,677.00), which total amount the Village requires to be raised by taxation for the 2025 tax levy year, and the Village Clerk of the Village is hereby ordered and directed to

file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the County Clerk of Champaign County, Illinois, on or before the date required by law.

Section 6. If any provisions of this Ordinance or the application of such provisions to any circumstances is held invalid for any reason whatsoever, the remainder of this Ordinance or the application of such provisions of this Ordinance to other circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect immediately on and after its passage and approval as required by law.

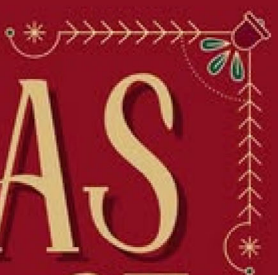
