A Regular Study Session of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Rantoul was held at at 6:00 P.M. Mayor Hall called the proceeding to order.

**Roll Call**

**Approval of Agenda**

Trustee Robertson moved to approve the agenda. Trustee Workman seconded the motion. On a roll call vote:

YEAS: Robertson, Haines, Workman, Crider, Wilson and Graham – 6.

NAYS: None – 0.

The motion carried 6-0.

**Public Participation**

Mayor Hall opened the public comment portion of the meeting per the Open Meetings Act. No individuals registered with the Village Clerk prior to the meeting.

**Items from the Mayor**

- A. The Mayor expressed condolences to family of the man who had a health problem at the pool. He thanked the life guards who took action right away. He also thanked the Fire Department, EMTs and Police Departments who responded.
- B. The Administrator thanked Mr. Milliken, Mr. Hunt, Ms. Schultz and the Champaign County Treasurer's office. Tomorrow is the last day for the first installment of real estate taxes to be paid. The Village will start issuing rebates next week.
- C. Next week the Mayor will bring forward a name for a Mayor Pro Temp.

**Items from Trustees**

- A. Trustee Robertson asked about updates on the airport. The Administrator said he would provide that information to the Trustees this week and put it online.
- B. Trustee Robertson said he may not be at the June 16 Board Meeting. He does not feel it is the right time to have a transfer station in Rantoul. He does believe they meet the requirements.
- C. Trustee Robertson asked when the Village could purchase the pot hole machine. The Administrator has asked Director Isley to prepare a report of where the money will come from in the Budget.
- D. Trustee Haines asked about the fire and police reports. The Administrator said they would be available at the Board Meeting.
- E. Trustee Haines had asked the Attorney for a copy of outstanding loans in January and still has not received that report. Attorney Wesner said he would get that out this week.

- B. The Mayor asked what positions were the most difficult to fill. The Human Resources Manager said that the Chief of Operations Waste Water is difficult to fill because of the required certifications and it is hard to find experienced linemen.

- A. The Department requested the approval of an Ordinance Amending Chapter 18, Article II, Section 21 of the Village Code in Connection with the Order of Command and Appointments within the Police Department. This Ordinance would reduce the number of authorized Lieutenant positions to two and create the position of Deputy Chief of Police. This was discussed at the Board's Strategic Planning Session. It will not have an impact on this year's budget.

### **Items from Community Planning and Development**

- A. Chris Milliken, Community Planning and Development, gave an update on the Downtown Reconstruction & Streetscaping Project. They hope to open up Tanner Street next week. The completion date is still the end of June.

### **Items from Public Works**

- A. The Department requested the approval of an Ordinance authorizing and approving a Loan Agreement from the Water Pollution Control Program in the amount of \$11,000,000. The plant has crucial equipment approaching the end of its reliable service life that needs upgrading. This is for the IEPA Loan, Phase 2.
- B. The Department requested the approval of a Construction Contract for the Electric Department proposed Prospect Substation Project. Bids were received on May 20. The Department is reviewing the two lowest bids and will have a contractor selected by the Board meeting. The two low bids are below the cost projection.
- C. The Department requested the approval of a Service Agreement for the Repair and Rehabilitation of Well 10 at the Water Treatment Plant. They have received quotes from three companies. This will be a complete rebuild. Reserved funds will be used for this project.

### **Items from Administrator**

The Administrator requested the approval of an Ordinance supplementing and amending Chapter 2, Article III of the Village Code to establish the position of Electric Director. The Administration wishes to establish an Electric Department, thereby separating it from the Public Works Department. To do so, a position for the new Director needs to be created for management and oversight. The Ordinance also outlines the duties and responsibilities of the Director.

This item will go to the Board for approval.

A Special Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Rantoul was held at 6:00 pm. President Hall presiding. President Hall called the meeting to order.

**Roll Call**

The Clerk called the roll, finding the following members present:

Mayor Smith, Trustees Workman, Crider, Wilson, Graham, Robertson and Haines – 7.

The following representatives of Village departments were also present:

Scott Eisenhauer, Administrator; Bob Coverdill, Airport Manager; Tana Ward, Executive Assistant, Audio/Visual; David Wesner, Attorney; Hank Gamel, Deputy Clerk and Janet Gray, Village Clerk.

**Approval of the Agenda**

Trustee Graham moved to approve the agenda for the meeting as presented. Trustee Crider seconded the motion. On a Roll Call vote:

YEAS: Graham, Robertson, Haines, Workman, Crider and Wilson – 6.

NAYS: None – 0.

Motion Approved 6-0.

**Public Participation**

Mayor Hall opened the public comment portion of the meeting per the Open Meetings Act.

- Lori Shields, 350 W. Champaign, stated she is against the Transfer Station, particularly at the proposed location.
- Rick Shields, General Manger Shields Sales, said he is concerned about Real Estate values, odors and truck traffic. He is against the location.
- Randy McKaufsky represents Westland Meadows Homeowners Association. They are concerned about the location, odor and rodents. They do not believe GFL adequately answered all the questions regarding the issues.
- Janaki Nair, attorney for Area Disposal reviewed the application process. In June 2025 an agreement was approved, the application was filed December 7, the public hearing held on April 17 and the record closed May 18. She believes that they have proved that Area Disposal Services met the siting requirements.
- Chris Kaler said he felt traffic would be busier. He does not see any reward for Rantoul for having the Transfer Station; only risk at this location.

- Art Hess restated that he thinks the Village has nothing to gain with the Transfer Station – only Area Disposal will gain. He is concerned with property values, heavy traffic and zoning.
- Kenda Hess thanked the community for supporting their business. She is concerned about blowing trash.

**Discussion of Area Disposal Service Proposed Transfer Station**

- Trustee Graham said he thought the Village should approve the Ordinance with conditions.
- Trustee Robertson thinks the facility should be in a different location. If Area Disposal can't pick up garbage effectively how can they properly run a Transfer Station.
- Trustee Haines agrees that the location should be somewhere else; perhaps on the former Air Force Base.

**Consideration of Ordinances & Resolution**

Trustee Workman moved to authorize and approve with conditions the Area Disposal Service, Inc. Siting Application for the proposed Rantoul Recycling and Transfer Station located Northeast of Interstate 57 and West Champaign Ave. The Application was filed, and the testimony and evidence concerning the Application, has established that the proposed Facility satisfies all the criteria for local siting approval set forth in Section 39.2 of the Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5) and Chapter 28, Article IV of the Rantoul Village Code. Trustee Graham seconded the motion. On a Roll Call vote:

YEAS: Workman, Crider, Graham, and Mayor Hall – 4.

NAYS: Wilson, Robertson and Haines - 3

Motion carried 4-3.

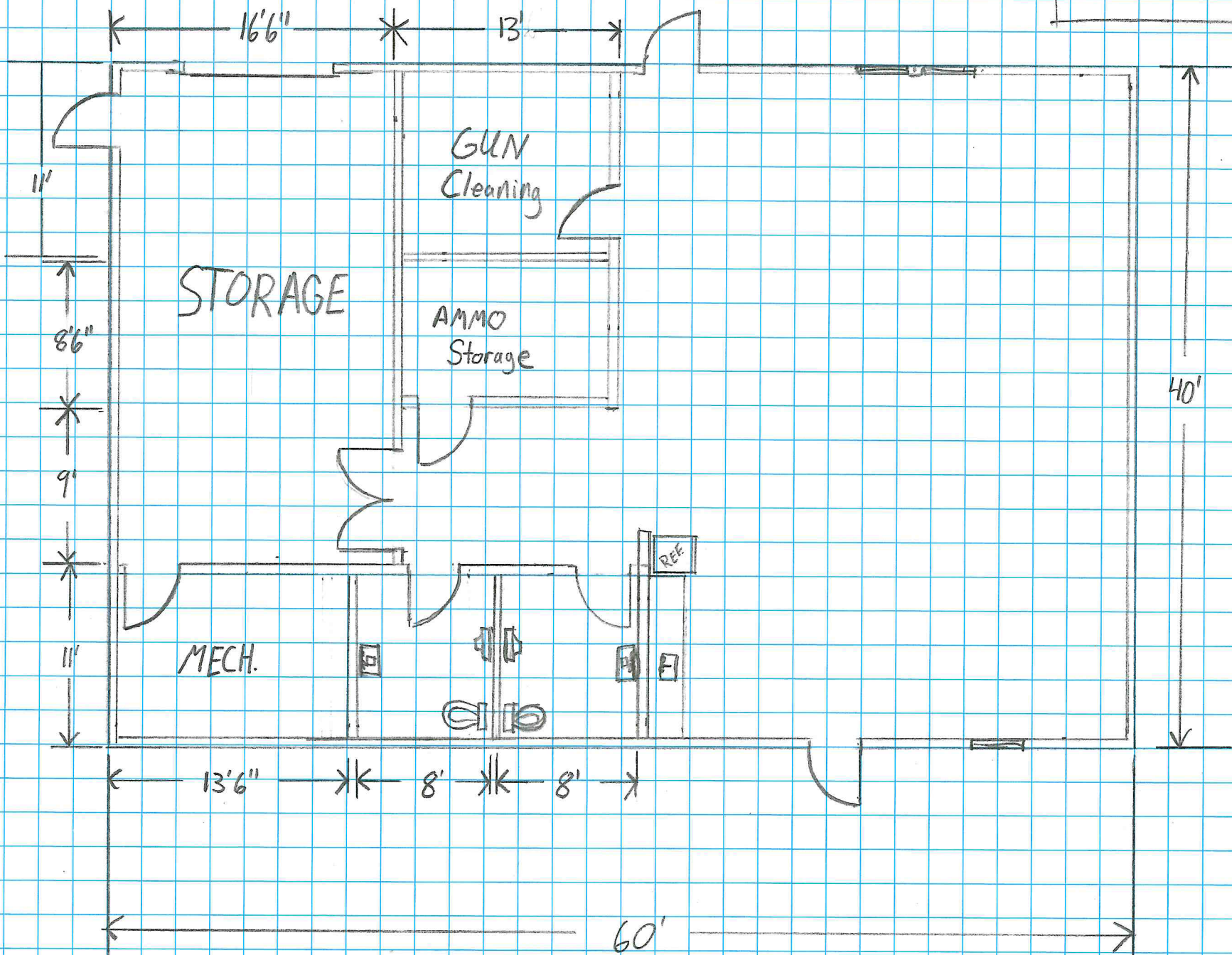

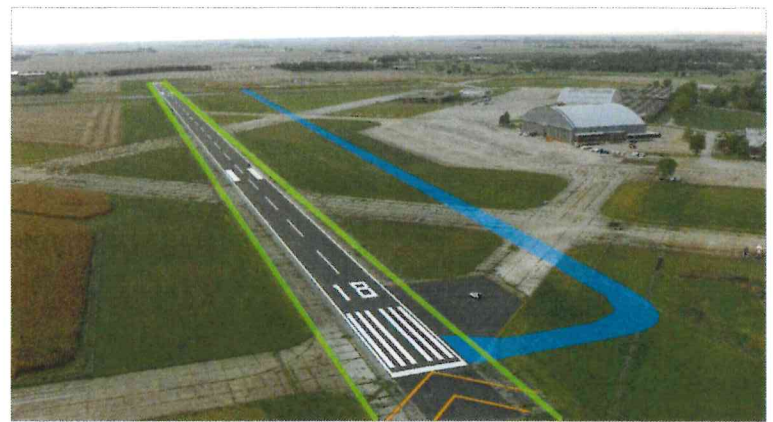
## MILITARY AIRPORT PROGRAM

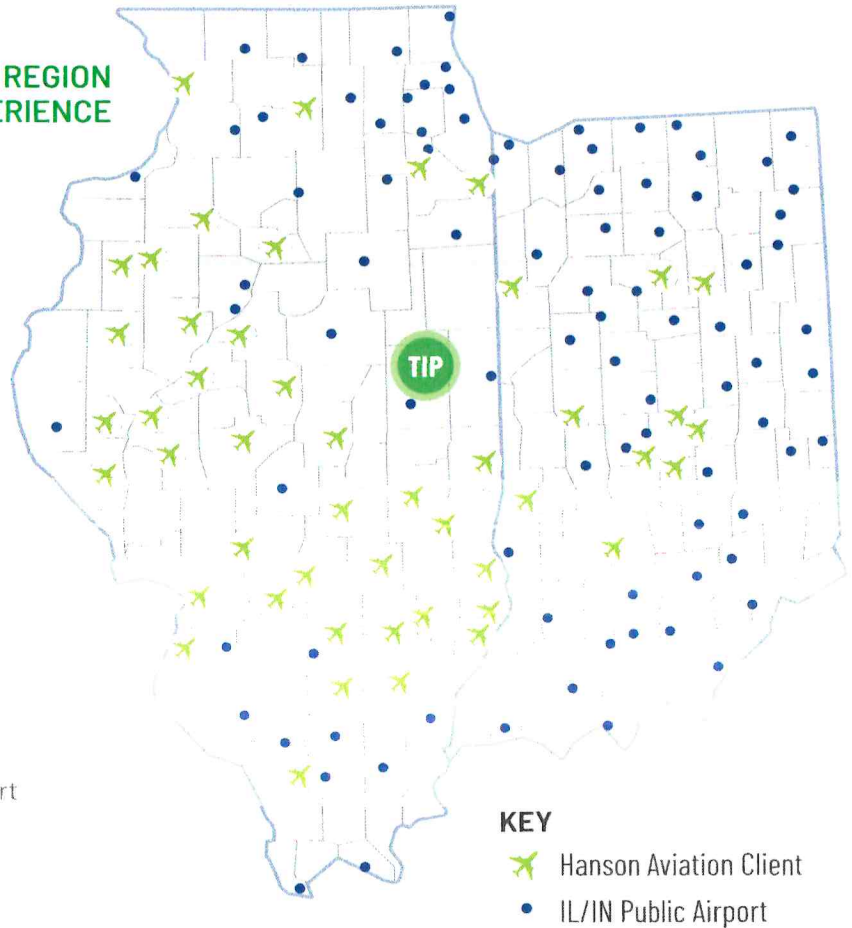

**SUMMARY HIGHLIGHTS:**

This item provides for the construction of the Pleasant Acres Sidewalks project. The project will consist of the construction of new sidewalks, including connecting to and extending existing sidewalks, starting at Winston Park and along Gates Drive on the North, and then continuing along Eater Drive to Harper Drive where the proposed sidewalks would match up with the recently completed sidewalk installed as part of the last Safe Routes to School Project. The sidewalks will then continue along Eater until they match up with existing sidewalks farther South in that neighborhood. There is a map in your packet depicting this area.

The project was advertised for bid in May, and bids were received and opened on June 12, 2026. A total of six (6) bids were received, and the bid tabulation is attached for reference. A low bid in the amount of \$428,855.00 was provided by A&A Concrete, LLC, which is the same contractor that has previously performed some sidewalk work for the Village. Staff determined that the bid and bidder met all requirements, and thus this bid is being recommended for acceptance.

The construction of this project would be paid for completely from grant funding, specifically Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) funds awarded from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT).

It is anticipated construction would start sometime in August and take approximately two months to complete.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:** Authorize the acceptance of the bid and awarding of a

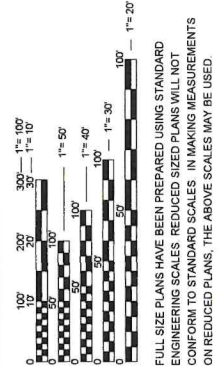

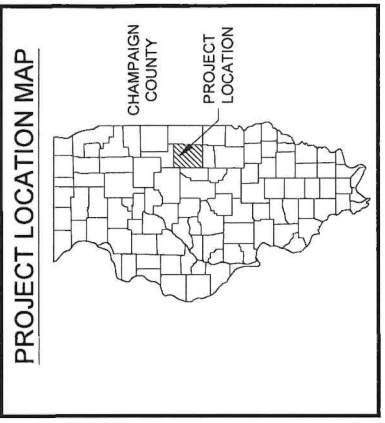

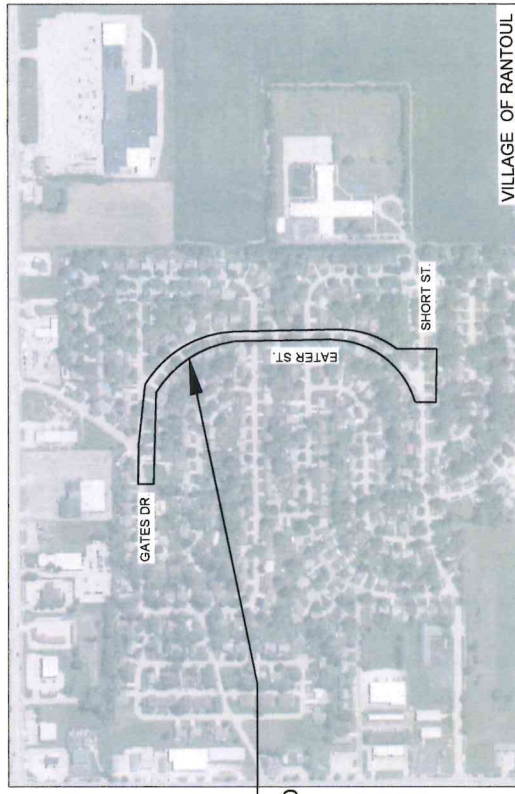

## Terms and Conditions

### 1. Applicable Terms and Conditions

(a) These terms and conditions of sale establish the rights, obligations, and remedies of Buyer and Seller that apply to any order issued by Buyer for the purchase of Seller's products and/or services ("Products"). No additional or different terms or conditions, whether contained in Buyer's purchase order form or in any other document or communication pertaining to Buyer's order, will be binding on Seller unless accepted in writing by an authorized representative of Seller. Seller expressly objects to and rejects any additional or different terms and conditions, which shall be ineffective.

(b) If Seller's order acknowledgement, invoice, other document, or electronic transmittal including or attaching these terms and conditions is found to be an acceptance of an offer, acceptance is expressly made conditional upon Buyer's assent solely to these terms and conditions, and acceptance of any part of Products delivered by Seller shall be deemed to constitute such assent by Buyer. If the order acknowledgement, invoice, other document, or electronic transmittal including or attaching these terms and conditions constitutes an offer, Buyer's acceptance of the offer is hereby limited to the terms of the offer.

### 2. Price, Payment Terms, and Title

(a) All prices represent those in effect at the time of quotation and are subject to change without notice. Unless prices are bid or quoted as "firm," Seller reserves the right to invoice at prices in effect at the date of shipment, regardless of any prior bid and whether notice was received by Buyer. Unless otherwise indicated, prices are stated in United States dollars and are exclusive of shipping, handling, shipping insurance, duties, and sales, use, excise or similar taxes. Export packaging or any other special handling requested by Buyer will be at Buyer's expense. A service charge of \$25 will be assessed for any order less than \$250. Seller requires a minimum \$100 emergency handling charge for all orders that require shipment the same day or next day.

(b) Buyer acknowledges that the pricing of the Products has been set based on the agreed allocation of risks contained in these terms and conditions. If, notwithstanding the provisions of these terms and conditions, a court of competent jurisdiction determines that Buyer's terms and conditions apply to an order, then Seller shall have the right to either (i) modify the prices (including retroactively) according to the additional level of risk and responsibility that Buyer's terms and conditions require Seller to undertake; or (ii) cancel the order any time after such a determination without liability for the termination other than for the Products already delivered on these terms and conditions.

(c) Unless different credit terms have been extended to Buyer in writing by Seller, payment terms are net 30 days after delivery or date of invoice, whichever first occurs, in the currency invoiced. Seller reserves the right to modify or withdraw credit terms at any time without notice. If Buyer fails to fulfill the terms of payment, Seller may defer further shipments to Buyer or, at its option, cancel the unshipped portions of Buyer's orders. Buyer agrees to pay interest on all past due invoices at the lesser of 18% per annum, compounded monthly, or the highest contractual rate allowable under the law.

(d) Until full payment of all obligations of the Buyer for an order, Seller reserves the title (but not the risk of loss) to all Products furnished under that order. If the Buyer defaults in payment or performance or becomes subject to insolvency, receivership or bankruptcy proceedings or makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or without the consent of Seller voluntarily or involuntarily sells, transfers, leases or permits any lien or attachment on the Products, Seller may treat all amounts then or thereafter owing by Buyer to be immediately due and payable and Seller at its election may repossess Products for which Buyer has not paid in full. In the event of repossession of Products under this section or under the section entitled "Security Interest," Buyer agrees that Seller may enter the premises where the Products may be located and remove them without notice and without being liable to Buyer for such repossession. Buyer will not set off invoiced amounts or any portion thereof against sums that are due or may become due from Seller, its parents, affiliates, or subsidiaries. Buyer grants Seller a security interest in Products for which title has passed to Buyer, products in which Products are incorporated, and Products that Seller sells (including all Products acquired hereafter from Seller, and all accessions, substitutions, replacements, and additions, and any proceeds from sale or disposition of Products), as security for performance by Buyer of all of its payment obligations under these terms and conditions (including obligations regarding future advances). Buyer consents to Seller's execution of any documents to evidence and perfect this security interest, and agrees to execute the same if requested by Seller.

### 3. Delivery and Risk of Loss

(a) Unless otherwise agreed in writing, all deliveries of Products will be EXW (Incoterms 2000) Seller's facility. Products will be packed in Seller's standard commercial shipping packages. Charges for shipping may not reflect net transportation costs paid by Seller. Buyer shall reimburse Seller for all costs of storage and handling incurred by Seller after the date that Seller is prepared to make shipment.

(b) Delivery and shipping dates are approximate and represent Seller's best estimate of the time required to make delivery or shipment. Time is not of the essence with respect to the transactions covered by these terms and conditions, except with respect to Buyer's obligation to make all related

payments. Seller's obligations under these terms and conditions will be dependent upon Seller's ability to obtain necessary raw materials and components. Seller shall have the right to make partial deliveries and to ship up to forty (40) days in advance of shipping date.

### 4. Acceptance

Acceptance shall occur, if not before, when Buyer fails to reject within ten (10) days after delivery of the Products. Buyer may rightfully reject only when a reasonable inspection shows that the Products fail to conform substantially to the specifications for the Products. Buyer waives any right to revoke acceptance. ### 5. Limited Warranty

(a) Seller warrants to each original Buyer of Products that Products are, at the time of delivery to the Buyer, in good working order and conform to Seller's official published specifications, provided that no warranty is made with respect to any Products, component parts, or accessories manufactured by others but supplied by Seller.

(b) Seller's obligation under this warranty for any Product proved not to be as warranted within the applicable warranty period is limited to, at its option, replacing the Product, refunding the purchase price of the Product, or using reasonable efforts to repair the Product during normal business hours at any authorized service facility of Seller. All costs of transportation of any Product claimed not to be as warranted and of any repaired or replacement Product to or from such service facility shall be borne by Buyer.

(c) Seller may require the return of any Product claimed not to be as warranted to one of its facilities as designated by Seller, transportation prepaid by Buyer, to establish a claim under this warranty. The cost of labor for removing a Product and for installing a repaired or replacement Product shall be borne by Buyer. Replacement parts provided under the terms of this warranty are warranted for the remainder of the warranty period of the Products in which they are installed to the same extent as if such parts were original components. Warranty services provided under these terms and conditions do not assure uninterrupted operations of Products; Seller shall not be liable for damages caused by any delays involving warranty service.

(d) The warranty period for Products is the shorter of twelve (12) months from the date of installation or eighteen (18) months from the date of shipment unless otherwise agreed by Seller in writing.

(e) EXCEPT FOR THE EXPRESS WARRANTY SET FORTH ABOVE, SELLER PROVIDES PRODUCTS AS-IS AND MAKES NO OTHER REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, STATUTORY OR OTHERWISE, REGARDING THE PRODUCTS, THEIR FITNESS FOR ANY PARTICULAR PURPOSE, THEIR MERCHANTABILITY, THEIR QUALITY, THEIR NONINFRINGEMENT, OR OTHERWISE. IN NO EVENT SHALL SELLER BE LIABLE FOR THE COST OF PROCUREMENT OR INSTALLATION OF SUBSTITUTE GOODS.

### 6. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Software, if included with a Product, is hereby licensed and not sold. The license is nonexclusive, and is limited to use with the Product with which it is included. No other use is permitted and Seller retains for itself (or, if applicable, its suppliers) all title and ownership to any software delivered hereunder, all of which contains confidential and proprietary information and which ownership includes without limitation all rights in patents, copyrights, trademarks and trade secrets. Buyer shall not attempt any sale, transfer, sublicense, reverse compilation or disassembly (save to the extent expressly permitted by law) or redistribution of the software. Buyer shall not copy, disclose or display any such software, or otherwise make it available to others.

### 14. Compliance with Laws

Buyer shall comply with all laws and regulations applicable to Products including all applicable import and export laws and regulations. Buyer and Buyer's Agent shall provide all information requested by Seller relating to Seller's voluntary or mandatory compliance with any law or regulation, and Buyer shall indemnify Seller for any losses incurred by Seller arising from Buyer's or Buyer's Agent's failure to provide the information requested by Seller.

### 15. Waiver

The quotes have been reviewed for completeness and the ability to meet specification requirements. Please see the attached Letter of Recommendation from BHMG Engineers, Inc. with a summary of the quotes for the purchase. The quote from United Utility Supply was the apparent low quote, and it did not include any noteworthy clarifications besides standard price escalators. United Utility Supply has a good list of completed reference projects. Their ability to quote all required materials and competitive pricing is why BHMG Engineers, Inc. recommends awarding the contract to United Utility Supply.</p> <p>Due to potential price escalators and potential design changes, we would advise a contingency fund of \$10,350.00.</p> <p>The purchase for these materials was included in the Electric Department Fiscal Year 2027 Reserves Budget.</p>

### Applicability

(a) These terms and conditions of sale (these "Terms") are the only terms that govern the sale of the goods incorporated, a Kentucky corporation or Deco Supply Company, Inc., a Kentucky corporation doing business named on the applicable purchase order, confirmation of sale, or invoice, as applicable ("Buyer"). Notwithstanding any written contract signed by both parties is in existence covering the sale of the Goods covered hereby, the terms and conditions set forth herein shall prevail to the extent they are inconsistent with these Terms and acknowledge such inconsistencies.

(b) The Seller prepared quotation, confirmation of sale, or invoice, as applicable (the "Sales Confirmation") shall comprise the entire agreement between the parties and supersede all prior or contemporaneous understandings.

## Change Orders

- (a) Buyer may, by written instructions and/or drawings issued to Seller's sales representative (each a "Change Order") (email is acceptable). Any change requested by the Buyer to any aspect or the scope of an order must be approved in writing by Seller. Seller's approval of a Change Order does not constitute an agreement to accept the change.
- (b) Upon approval, Seller will use its best efforts to submit to Buyer a proposal for the Change Order, which includes the cost of materials, labor, and overhead. Seller will also provide to Buyer a list of suppliers and manufacturers relating to the relevant Sales Confirmation. If Buyer accepts such cost proposal, Buyer shall pay for the change order, subject to the cost proposal and the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

## Cancellations

- (a) Cancellations of the purchase of Goods held in stock by Seller ("Stock Goods") may be canceled only with the approval of Seller, given in Seller's sole discretion.
- (b) Seller will use reasonable efforts to approve the cancellations of Buyer's purchase of Goods not held in stock. To the extent Seller can cancel the order of Non-Stock Goods with the applicable vendor, Seller will provide notice of cancellation to Buyer. Any additional fees or charges incurred by Seller to cancel the order of Non-Stock Goods shall be charged to and payable by Buyer if no refund is applicable.
- (c) Seller will use reasonable efforts to approve the cancellations of Buyer's purchase of specialty manufactured Goods. To the extent Seller can cancel the order of specialty manufactured Goods with the applicable vendor, Seller will provide notice of acceptance of cancellation to Buyer. Any additional fees or charges incurred by Seller to cancel the order of specialty manufactured Goods shall be charged to and payable by Buyer if no refund is applicable.
- (d) All cancellations may be subject to a cancellation fee as determined by Seller in its sole discretion.

## Delivery of Goods

- (a) The Goods will be delivered within a reasonable time after the receipt of Buyer's purchase order. Seller shall notify Buyer of the date of delivery of the Goods in transit.
- (b) Unless otherwise agreed in writing by the parties, Seller shall deliver the Goods to the location indicated in the purchase order ("Delivery Point") using Seller's standard methods for packaging and shipping such Goods. Buyer shall take responsibility for the Goods within the number of days of Seller's written notice that the Goods have been delivered to the Delivery Point. Buyer shall be responsible for providing equipment and labor reasonably suited for receipt of the Goods at the Delivery Point, and will unload and store the Goods. Seller incurs no demurrage or other expense.
- (c) Seller may, in its sole discretion, without liability or penalty, make partial shipments of Goods to Buyer. Buyer shall pay for the units shipped whether such shipment is in whole or partial fulfillment of Buyer's purchase order.
- (d) If for any reason Buyer fails to accept delivery of any of the Goods on the date fixed pursuant to Seller's written notice, or if Seller is unable to deliver the Goods at the Delivery Point on such date because Buyer's equipment or labor is not available, Seller shall not be liable for the Goods.

## Title and Risk of Loss

Unless otherwise provided in the Sales Confirmation, Delivery of the Goods shall be made FOB shipping point. Buyer hereby grants to Seller a lien on and security interest in and to all of the Goods under the Sales Confirmation, wherever located, and whether now existing or hereafter arising or acquired from time to time, including replacements or modifications thereof, as well as all proceeds (including insurance proceeds) of the foregoing. This provision constitutes a purchase money security interest under the Kentucky Uniform Commercial Code.

## Quantity

If Seller delivers to Buyer a quantity of Goods of up to ten percent (10%) more or less than the quantity set forth in the Sales Confirmation, Buyer shall be entitled to object to or reject the Goods or any portion of them by reason of the surplus or shortfall and the Sales Confirmation adjusted pro rata.

## Inspection and Rejection of Nonconforming Goods

(a) Buyer shall inspect the Goods within three (3) business days of receipt ("Inspection Period"). Buyer will notify Seller in writing of any Nonconforming Goods during the Inspection Period and furnishes such written notice as required by Seller. "Nonconforming Goods" means only the following: (i) product shipped is different than product's label or packaging incorrectly identifies its contents.

(b) If Buyer timely notifies Seller of any Nonconforming Goods, Seller shall, in its sole discretion, (i) replace such Goods, or (ii) credit or refund the Price for such Nonconforming Goods, together with any reasonable shipping and handling charges in connection therewith. Buyer shall ship, at Seller's expense and risk of loss, the Nonconforming Goods to Seller. If Seller exercises its option to replace Nonconforming Goods, Seller shall, after receiving Buyer's written notice, ship the replaced Goods to the Delivery Point, at Seller's expense and risk of loss.

(c) Buyer acknowledges and agrees that the remedies set forth in Section 7(b) are Buyer's exclusive remedies. Except as provided under Section 7(b), all sales of Goods to Buyer are made on a one-way basis and Buyer shall be bound by this Agreement to Seller.

## Returns and Refunds of Conforming Goods

Subject to Seller's written approval, which shall be given in Seller's sole discretion, Seller will accept a return of Stock Goods for a refund of purchase price, less the original shipping and handling costs for, provided such return is made within sixty (60) days of receipt. Stock Goods must be in their original condition and unused. Approval of any Goods designated as Non-Stock Goods will be on a case-by-case basis and any final decision shall be made by Seller, in its sole discretion. To evaluate return options of Buyer's purchase of Non-Stock Goods or Goods that are specialty manufactured, if such return is approved, Seller will provide notice of acceptance of such return.

## Price

- (a) Unless otherwise noted as FIRM, Buyer shall purchase the Goods from Seller at the prices (the "Prices") of the Goods to a carrier for shipment to Buyer.
- (b) All Prices quoted are valid for thirty (30) days if the Good is a Stock Good, and for the applicable vendor'
- (c) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in a separate agreement between the parties, Seller reserves event of any increase in tariffs, levies, duties, freight or importation cost or charges, supplier pricing or surc In such event, Seller will provide an updated quote or price and will not ship Product until Buyer receives a errors are not binding on Seller.
- (d) All Prices are exclusive of all sales, use, and excise taxes, and any other similar taxes, duties, and charges Authority on any amounts payable by Buyer. Buyer shall be responsible for all such charges, costs, and tax for any taxes imposed on, or with respect to, Seller's income, revenues, gross receipts, personal or real prop

## Payment Terms

- (a) Unless otherwise agreed by Buyer and Seller in writing which is signed by both parties, Buyer shall pay (30) calendar days from the date of Seller's invoice. Buyer shall make all payments hereunder in US dollars
- (b) Buyer shall pay interest on all late payments at the lesser of the rate of 1.5% per month or the highest ra daily and compounded monthly. **WHEREAS**, the Village of Rantoul, Champaign County, Illinois (the “**Municipality**”), is a Home Rule unit pursuant to the provisions of Section 6, Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois; and,

**WHEREAS**, at the November 6, 2018 general election, the electors of the Village of Rantoul approved a proposition to elect Village Trustees by district; and,

**WHEREAS**, the first Trustees elected by district were sworn in on May 4, 2021, and the Village began operating under the “by district” provision as of that date; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Village has operated for more than four years under the “by district” provision; and,

**WHEREAS**, Article VII, Section 6(f) of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides: “A Home Rule municipality shall have the power to provide for its officers, their manner of selection, and terms of office only as approved by referendum or as otherwise authorized by law.”; and,

**WHEREAS**, Sections 3.1-25-80 and 3.1-25-85 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-80, 65 ILCS 5/3.1-25-85) do not preempt Home Rule authority granted under Section 6, Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois; and,

**WHEREAS**, the President and Board of Trustees (the “Corporate Authorities”) have been asked to adopt an Ordinance seeking to put a binding referendum on the ballot for the general election to be held on November 3, 2026 for the voters to decide whether to abandon election of Trustees by district, and thereafter elect Trustees on a Village-wide basis.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF RANTOUL, CHAMPAIGN COUNTY, ILLINOIS**, as follows:

**Section 1. Election of Trustees.** That the following binding referendum be submitted to the voters of the Village of Rantoul: “Shall the Village of Rantoul abandon the method of electing trustees from districts so that trustees shall be hereafter elected on a Village-wide basis.”

**Section 2. ## VILLAGE OF RANTOUL BOARD OF TRUSTEES

### RULES OF ORDER

#### **RULE I – QUORUM: ORDER OF BUSINESS**

The “Village Board” shall consist of the Village President and Trustees. A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of a majority of all the members of the Village Board entitled by law to be elected.

When a quorum is physically present at a regular meeting, the Village Board shall proceed to the business before it, which shall generally be conducted in the following order:

- A. Call to Order
- B. Roll Call of Members
- C. Approval of Agenda
- D. Public Participation
- E. Reports of Village Officers
- F. Approval of bills and monthly financial reports
- G. Approval of Minutes of the proceedings of the previous meeting or meetings, with amendment of the same, *if applicable*
- H. Consideration of Contracts, Resolutions, and Ordinances
- I. New Business for Discussion
- J. General Announcements
- K. Adjournment

No member of the Village Board shall be prohibited from addressing the Village Board on a matter of business by the order of business adopted. The order of business may be altered or amended by the Village President from time to time, as the Village President determines necessary or desirable.

#### **RULE II – REMOTE PARTICIPATION PROHIBITED**

No member of the Village Board who is unable to be physically present at any meeting or study session shall be permitted to cast any votes, or participate in the discussion of items of business before the Village Board via electronic, telephonic, or any other alternative means of communication.

#### **RULE III – PRESIDING OFFICER**

The term “Presiding Officer” shall refer to the Village President, and in the absence of the Village President, shall apply equally to the President Pro Tempore. In the absence of both the President and President Pro Tempore, the term shall apply to the temporary Presiding Officer elected by the members of the Village Board.

In the absence of the Village President and President Pro Tempore, the Village Clerk shall call the proceeding to order, whereupon a temporary Presiding Officer shall be elected by the majority vote of the members of the Village Board present as the first order of business. Upon the arrival of the Village President or President Pro Tempore, the temporary Presiding Officer shall relinquish the Chair at the conclusion of the item of business then before the board.

The Village President may vote only where Statutes or Ordinances of the Village require more than a majority vote of the Village Board in the event of a tie, or where one-half of the Trustees elected have voted in favor of an Ordinance, Resolution, or motion, even though there is no tie vote.

#### **RULE IV – DUTIES OF PRESIDING OFFICER**

The Presiding Officer shall preside and act as the Chair at all regular and special meetings and study sessions of the Village Board. The Presiding Officer shall preserve order and decorum and may speak to points of order in preference to other members of the Village Board, and shall decide all questions of order subject to appeal. The Presiding Officer may speak to matters being considered by the Village Board without relinquishing the Chair. If the Presiding Officer refuses to allow any Trustee to exercise the right to appeal a decision of the Presiding Officer, the Trustees may consider and pass upon the matter in spite of the Presiding Officer's failure to grant them an appeal. In case of any disturbances or disorderly conduct, the Presiding Officer shall have the power to require the Chamber to be cleared.

Every Trustee, prior to speaking, making a motion or seconding the same, shall address the Presiding Officer, and shall not proceed with the remarks until recognized and named by the Presiding Officer. The recognized speaker shall limit the remarks to the question under debate avoiding personalities, and refraining from impugning the motives of any other Trustee's argument or vote. When two or more Trustees address the Presiding Officer at the same time, the Presiding Officer shall name the Trustee who is first to speak.

The President Pro Tempore or temporary Presiding Officer, when acting as Presiding Officer, shall vote on all questions on which the vote is taken by yeas and nays, with his or her name being called last by the Village Clerk.

#### **RULE V – MOTIONS GENERALLY**

A motion is a formal statement by a member of the Trustees of a proposal or question to the Village Board for consideration and action. No motion shall be debated or otherwise acted upon by the Village Board unless it has received an appropriate second, or unless otherwise provided in these rules. No further action is required on a motion which does not receive a second. Neither the maker nor the seconder of a motion shall be required to vote in favor of that motion.

If a question under consideration contains more than one distinct proposition, it may be divided upon the request of any of the Trustees.

When a motion is made and seconded, it shall be restated by the Presiding Officer before a vote is taken.

A motion, once before the Village Board, may not be withdrawn by the maker without the consent of the seconder.

## **RULE VI – VOTING**

When the Village Clerk has commenced to call roll of the Village Board for the taking of a vote, all debate on the question before the Village Board shall be deemed concluded. During the taking of the vote, a member shall be permitted to briefly explain his or her vote, and shall respond to the call of his or her name by the Village Clerk by answering “yea” or “nay” as the case may be.

The Village Clerk shall begin taking any roll call vote with the Trustee by whom the pending motion has been made, then by calling the name of the Trustee seated immediately to his or her left, and continuing to call the names of the remaining Trustees in like fashion until all names have been called and answered. The Presiding Officer shall always be the last member to voice his or her vote, if authorized.

A roll call vote shall be required for the following:

- A. All Resolutions or motions to create an office or a position of employment, to create any liability against the Village, to incur any expenditure, or to appropriate money;
- B. All Ordinances;
- C. Approval by Omnibus vote of any items listed under the Consent Agenda

The Presiding Officer may utilize a voice vote for any other matters where a roll call vote is not required by law; provided, however, that a roll call vote shall be taken upon the timely request of any Trustee.

A vote lacking the required number of affirmative votes shall constitute defeat of the motion under consideration.

A Trustee may change his or her vote only if a timely request to do so is made prior to the announcement of the vote by the Presiding Officer.

Every Trustee who shall be present when a question is stated from the Presiding Officer shall vote thereon unless excused by the other members of the Village Board.

Where the temporary absence of a members of the Village Board during the course of a convened meeting results in a lack of quorum, the matter then under consideration shall be considered as having been postponed until the next regular meeting. The meeting may continue after the postponement has been announced by the Presiding Officer and the member breaking the quorum has resumed his or her presence; otherwise the Presiding Officer shall declare the meeting adjourned after such announcement.

The Presiding Officer shall announce the vote on every matter upon which a vote is taken, and a vote on any matter shall not be effective until announced by the Presiding Officer.

## **RULE VII – CONSIDERATION FOR FINAL ACTION**

No item on the agenda of a regular meeting of the Village Board shall be considered for final action at such regular meeting unless: (i) such item was presented and discussed at any prior regular or special meeting or study session of the Village Board; (ii) such item was presented and discussed in a written report or memorandum received by the members of the Village Board at least 48 hours prior to such regular meeting; or (iii) such item is retained on the agenda for final action by the

affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the members of the Village Board who are present and voting.

### **RULE VIII – CONSIDERATION OF ITEMS BY OMNIBUS VOTE**

The Village Clerk, or his or her designee, in preparing the agenda for any regular meeting, may include regular, recurring or routine matters under the heading of “Consent Agenda” provided that the inclusion of any items under this heading shall first be authorized by the Village President or the Village Administrative Officer. No item requiring greater than a majority vote shall be placed upon the Consent Agenda.

Any member of the Village Board may request that an item or items be removed from the proposed Consent Agenda for the purpose of additional discussion, debate, or separate vote. Upon such request, the item or items shall be removed from the Consent Agenda and shall be considered, debated, and voted upon separately as the next items of business immediately following a vote upon the Consent Agenda. Action may be taken on all items remaining on the Consent Agenda by a single motion made, seconded and adopted by roll call vote of those members of the Village Board present. The taking of an omnibus vote on the items listed upon the Consent Agenda shall for all intents and purposes, and with the like effect, be as if the vote in each case had been taken separately by yeas and nays, and separately recorded in the journal.

### **RULE IX – REQUESTS TO ADDRESS THE BOARD: PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

Members of the public shall be permitted to address the Village Board during a designated portion of each regular meeting, regular study session, and special meeting, to comment on any matters of public concern of Village Business.

No person shall address the Village Board without having first secured the recognition of the Presiding Officer.

Each member of the public addressing the Village Board shall be limited to three minutes for his or her presentation, unless authorized to receive additional time by the consent of a majority of the Village Board present. The Village Clerk, or in his or her absence the Deputy Village Clerk, shall be designated as official timekeeper, and shall be responsible for notifying the Presiding Officer when the allotted time for each speaker has expired. In the absence of both the Village Clerk and Deputy Village Clerk, the Village Board shall designate another Village employee or officer to serve as timekeeper. The total time allotted to “public participation” in a meeting will be 30 minutes, unless additional time is authorized by the consent of a majority of the Village Board present.

Each member of the public addressing the Board shall be expected to conform to conventional standards of decorum.

Only the Presiding Officer shall have the authority to request that a speaker suspend his or her remarks for exceeding the prescribed time limit or for any other reason

Each member of the public, before addressing the Village Board shall be required to sign in with the Village Clerk before the meeting is called to Order. Members of the public may comment on any matters of public concern or Village business at each regular study session and regular meeting. Comments from the public at a special meeting shall be limited in scope to only those matters of

business then under imminent consideration by the Village Board at that special meeting.

Other than during the designated period provided for public participation, the Village Board shall follow the prepared agenda. The members of the Village Board shall enter into the discussion of agenda items in a manner which permits other members of the Village Board, Village staff, and members of the public to hear the proceedings of the Village Board, but shall refrain from interaction with members of the public during business sessions. The Presiding Officer may, in his or her discretion, call on members of the public for information which may assist the Village Board in consideration of any agenda item.

## **RULE X – MINUTES: DOCUMENTS**

Minutes of all meetings and study sessions shall be permanently recorded in the form of a journal. Such Minutes shall be prepared and maintained by the Office of the Village Clerk and shall include the following:

- A. The date, time, and location of the meeting or study session
- B. The members recorded as either physically present or absent
- C. A general summary of all matters proposed, discussed or decided
- D. A record of any and all votes taken

The Minutes of all meetings and study sessions shall be approved by the vote of the Village Board at the following regular meeting. Reading of the Minutes shall not be necessary prior to approval, provided that the Village Clerk has provided each member with a copy of the drafted minutes in advance of the meeting. The Minutes may be revised at any time by the Village Clerk to correct spelling, grammar, numbering, or other such technical defects. Prior to approval, any members of the Village Board may, through the Presiding Officer, request the privilege of amending or correcting the Minutes for the purpose of maintaining truth and accuracy in the journal of the Village Board. If objection is made by any member of the Village Board to such amendment or correction, a majority vote of the Village Board shall be necessary for adoption of the correction or amendment.

The Village Clerk shall attest to the passage of all Ordinances and Resolutions by his or her signature, and shall affix the seal of the Village of Rantoul to all such documents. In the absence of the Village Clerk, the Deputy Village Clerk shall be authorized to sign the name of the Village Clerk on any of the aforementioned documents.

## **RULE XI – APPROVE OR VETO**

All Ordinances of whatever kind, and any Resolution or motion creating any liability against the Village or providing for the expenditure or appropriation of its money, or the sale of Village property, shall be deposited with the Village Clerk, and if the Village President approves thereof, the Village President shall sign the same, and such as are not approved shall be returned to the Village Board with objections thereto in writing at the next regular meeting of the Village Board occurring not less than five days after the passage thereof. Such veto may extend to any one or more items or appropriations contained in any Ordinance making an appropriation, or to the entire Ordinance; and in case the veto only extends to a part of such Ordinance, the residue thereof shall take effect and be in force. But in case the Village President shall fail to return any Ordinance with his or her objections thereto by the time aforesaid, such Ordinances shall become effective despite the absence of the Village President's signature.

Upon the return of any Ordinance by the Village President, the vote by which the same was passed may be reconsidered by the Village Board at its next regular meeting after the return of the veto; and if, after such reconsideration, two-thirds of all the Trustees then holding office shall agree, by yeas and nays, to pass the same, it shall go into effect notwithstanding the Village President's veto.

## **RULE XII – VERBATIM RECORDING OF OPEN MEETINGS**

A verbatim recording of the proceedings of each open meeting and study session of the Village Board shall be prepared and maintained by the office of the Village Clerk, and shall be made available for public inspection or copying upon request. The verbatim recording of each open meeting or study session shall be maintained by the Village for a period of not less than four years from the date of the approval of the official Minutes of the respective meeting or study session. After the retention period is concluded, the Village Clerk, or his or her designee may, with the approval of the Village Board, petition the Local Records Commission of the State of Illinois for authorization to destroy or otherwise dispose of those verbatim recordings.

The Village Board may from time to time determine that the verbatim recordings of particular meetings or study sessions hold significant historical value and may direct the Village Clerk to extend the retention period for such records accordingly.

## **RULE XIII – CLOSED SESSIONS: MINUTES AND RECORDINGS**

The Village Clerk, or his or her designee, shall keep and maintain written Minutes of all closed session meetings of the Village Board as defined by the Illinois Open Meetings Act as now existing or as hereafter amended. The Minutes of closed session meetings shall be reviewed and approved periodically by the Village Board in closed session; provided that such review occurs not less frequently than once every six months. Minutes of closed session meetings shall be made available to the public only after the Board has determined that it is no longer necessary to protect the public interest or the privacy of an individual. Any vote to authorize the public release of closed session Minutes shall be taken openly by the Village Board in the form of a Resolution.

In addition to written Minutes, the Village Clerk or his or her designee, shall keep and maintain a verbatim recording of all closed session proceedings. The Office of the Village Clerk shall be responsible for maintaining the recording equipment and a sufficient amount of cassette tapes or other recording materials as necessary to comply therewith.

The Village Clerk shall be responsible for maintaining all verbatim recordings of closed session meetings until such time that they are authorized for destruction by resolution of the Village Board in accordance with the Illinois Open Meetings Act. The verbatim recordings and the separate journal of closed session shall be maintained in a secure file, which may only be accessed by the Village Clerk, or such personnel as may be authorized by the Village Clerk.

The Minutes and verbatim recordings of all closed session meetings shall be made available for inspection of any member of the Village Board; provided that such inspection is made in the presence of the Village Clerk, or his or her designee. Duplicate copies of verbatim recordings or Minutes of closed session meetings shall not be produced for any member without the specific authorization of the Village Board.

## **RULE XIV – EXPULSION OF MEMBERS**

Any member of the Village Board acting or appearing in a disgraceful manner, or who uses opprobrious or insulting language to or about any other member of the Village Board, or who does not obey the order of the Presiding Officer, shall be, on motion, censured by a majority vote of the members of the Village Board present, or expelled by a two-thirds vote of all members of the Village Board elected. No member of the Village Board may be expelled a second time for the same incident.

## **RULE XV – SUSPENSION OF RULES**

These rules may be temporarily suspended by a vote of two-thirds of the Trustees present, except in cases where suspension of these rules would result in the violation of federal or state Statutes or local Ordinances. These rules shall not be repealed, altered, or amended unless notice thereof shall have been in writing, and the alteration and amendment submitted is at least one meeting prior thereto the two-thirds of the Trustee shall concur therein.

## **RULES XVI – ADOPTION OF ROBERT’S RULES OF ORDER REVISED**

The Rules of Parliamentary Procedure comprised in the latest published edition of “Robert’s Rules of Order Revised” shall govern the Village Board in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with these rules or the statutes and laws of the State of Illinois.

## **RULE XVII – FAILURE TO OBSERVE PROCEDURES**

These Rules of Order of the Village Board, and the procedures contained herein, are adopted to expedite the transaction of business of the Village Board in an orderly fashion, and they are deemed to be procedural in nature only. Any failure to strictly observe these Rules of Order by the Village Board shall not affect the jurisdiction of the Village Board, nor shall it serve to invalidate any action taken at a meeting that is otherwise held in conformity with applicable law.

### Former Chanute AFB PFAS Remedial Investigation Nearing Completion

**UPCOMING PUBLIC MEETING**

The next public meeting will be held at the Village Hall on Wednesday, July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026, at 7 pm. The public meeting will be live streamed, and video will be available for viewing on the Village of Rantoul Facebook page. The Air Force will provide an update on the PFAS Remedial Investigation at Chanute.

#### Remedial Investigation at Former AFFF Areas

The Air Force is working closely with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency to address Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) due to historical use of aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) at the former Chanute Air Force Base (AFB). Early evaluations confirmed PFAS in several areas such as fire training, fire demonstration, wastewater treatment plant, dredge spoils, and sewage sludge disposal, leading the Air Force to begin a comprehensive Remedial Investigation to understand the extent of impacts and any potential risks. Fieldwork for the investigation began in 2024 and will continue through 2027, focusing on defining where PFAS is located and how it may affect people and the environment.

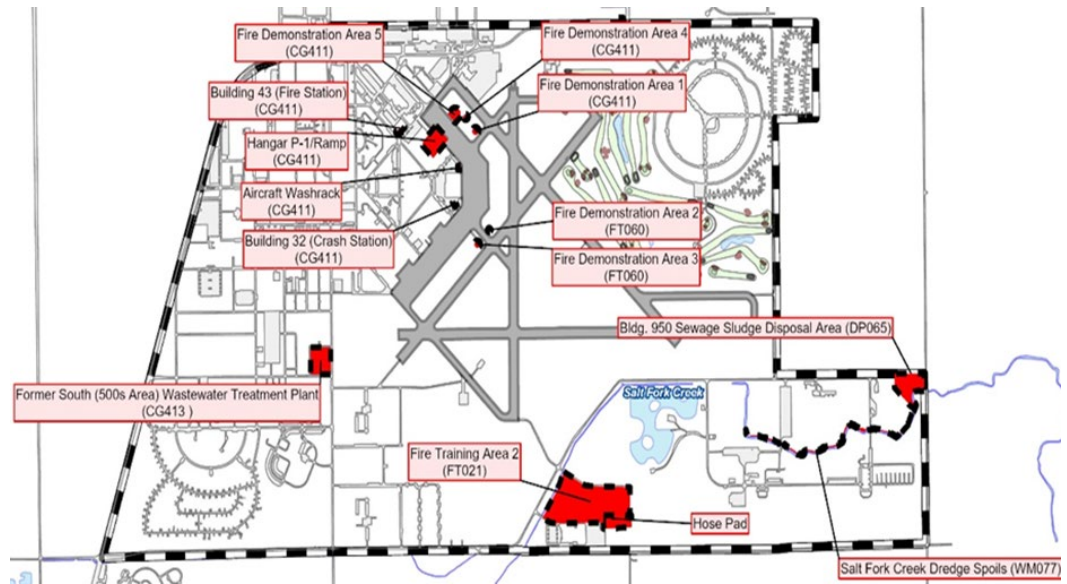


Figure 1: AFFF Areas

#### Progress Report

The Air Force has conducted five sampling mobilizations to define the nature and extent of PFAS due to historic AFFF use. In total, the Air Force has collected 648 groundwater samples and 983 soil samples, along with surface water, outfall, and sediment samples in Salt Fork Creek; sanitary sewer and storm sewer samples; and surface water samples from Heritage Lake.

As the investigation has progressed into Mobilization 5, sampling efforts have expanded to incorporate regulatory feedback and close remaining data gaps needed to evaluate potential risks to human health and the environment. PFAS impacts have been delineated at most of the AFFF areas, with only a few locations requiring additional sampling.

## Anthropogenic Background Study

The Air Force is also completing an Anthropogenic Background Study. This study helps determine whether low levels of PFAS found in the area come from everyday sources, such as consumer products, past light industrial activities, or regional conditions, rather than from the former base activities. To do this, samples were collected from locations that are far enough away from known Air Force PFAS release areas to make sure they aren't influenced by base-related activities. By comparing these samples to the results from the investigation areas, the study helps the Air Force understand which PFAS levels are part of anthropogenic background conditions in the former base.

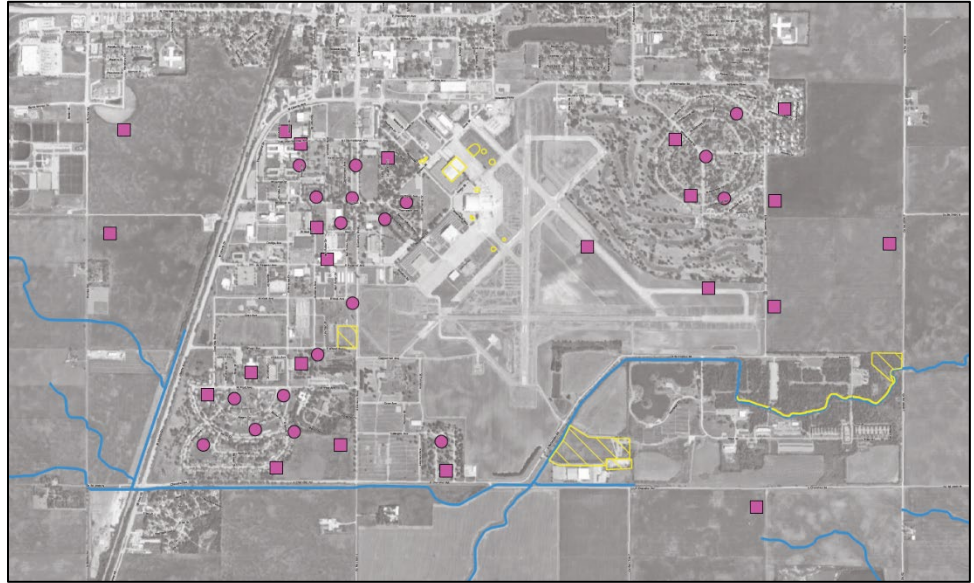
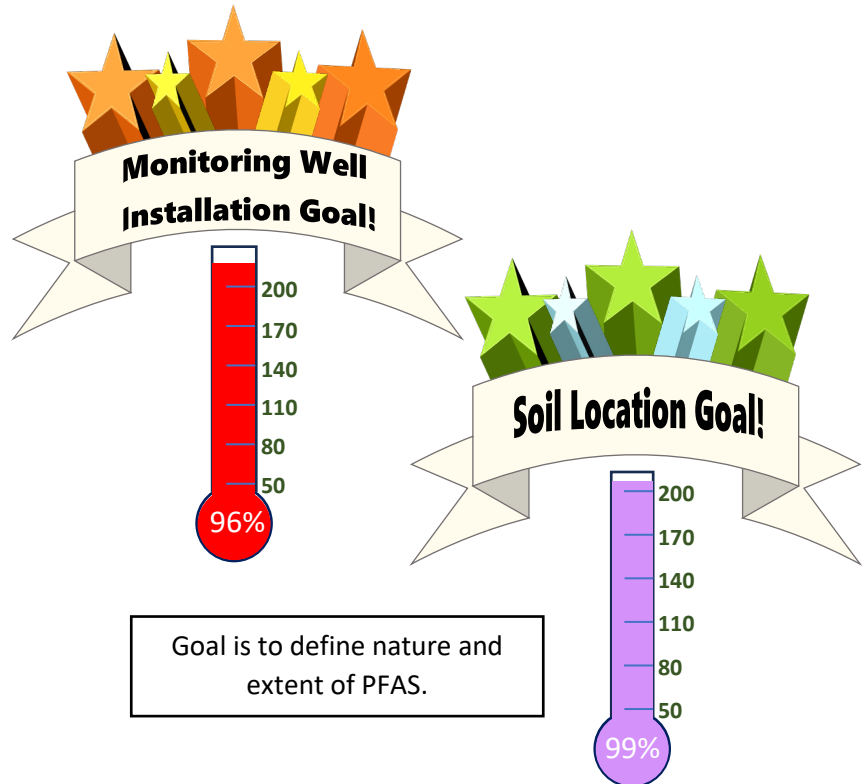


Figure 2: Anthropogenic Background Study Sample Locations

## Next Steps

The next mobilization will focus on completing delineation of PFAS at a few locations for groundwater and one location for soil. Additional studies, such as fish tissue sampling, are being incorporated into the remedial investigation in coordination with Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, out of abundance of caution, to ensure there are no impacts to the community or local ecosystems. Together, these remaining tasks will close out the sampling phase of the remedial investigation, after which evaluation of potential risks to human health and the environment will begin.
