

**RANTOUL VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
REGULAR BOARD MEETING
JUNE 9, 2026**

A Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Rantoul was held at 6:00 P.M., President Hall presiding. President Hall called the meeting to order.

Invocation & Pledge of Allegiance

Rev. Wayne Clevenger of the Rantoul Church of the Nazarene opened the meeting in prayer. Following the invocation, Trustee Wilson led the audience in recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call

The Clerk called the roll, finding the following members were physically present:

Approval of Agenda

Trustee Robertson moved to approve the agenda for the meeting, as presented. Trustee Wilson seconded the motion. On a Roll Call vote:

YEAS: Robertson, Haines, Workman, Crider, Wilson and Graham – 6.

NAYS: None – 0.

The motion carried 6-0.

Public Participation

Mayor Hall opened the public comment portion of the meeting per the Open Meetings Act.

Trustee Graham moved to approve the Consent Agenda items by omnibus vote. Trustee Robertson seconded the motion.

Trustee Haines asked why the Mayor felt the need to name a Mayor Pro Tempore. The Mayor said he thought it was professional and timely to name one.

Trustee Haines asked about the payments from the Village to Rush Softball. The Administrator said it was to pay for the referees.

On a Roll Call vote:

The motion carried 4-2.

B. Consideration of Bids, Contracts & Other Items of Expenditure

Trustee Graham moved to authorize and approve a Construction Contract for the Electric Department's Proposed Prospect Substation Project with LE Myers in the amount of \$4,851,981.12, with a Contingency Fund of \$485,000.00. Trustee Robertson seconded the motion. On a Roll Call vote:

The motion carried 6-0.

Trustee Graham moved to authorize waiving the Formal Bidding Process, and moved to authorize and approve a Service Agreement for the repair and rehabilitation of Well 10 at the Water Treatment Plant with Municipal Well and Pump in the Amount of \$63,930.00, with a Contingency Fund of \$6,400.00.

Trustee Wilson seconded the motion. On a Roll Call vote:

The motion carried 6-0.

Trustee Graham moved to authorize and approve a Development Agreement between Village of Rantoul and Maverick Pipe Group, LLC. Trustee Crider seconded the motion. On a Roll Call vote:

YEAS: Crider, Wilson, Graham, Robertson, Haines and Workman – 6.

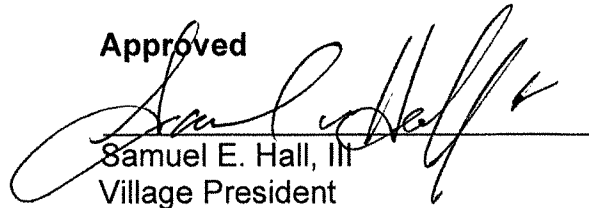

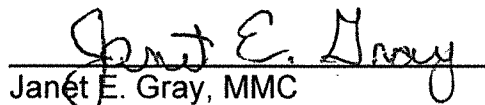

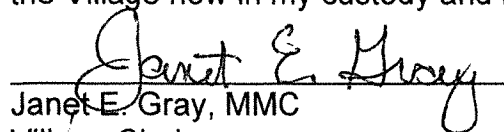
